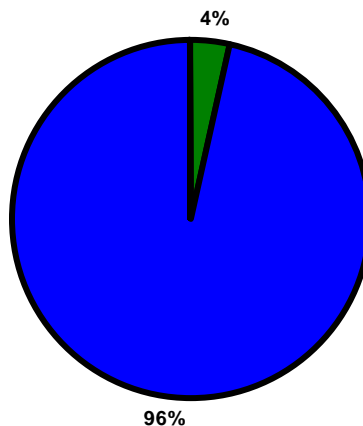
Types of animals observed, Wisconsin NatureMapping, February 2007
