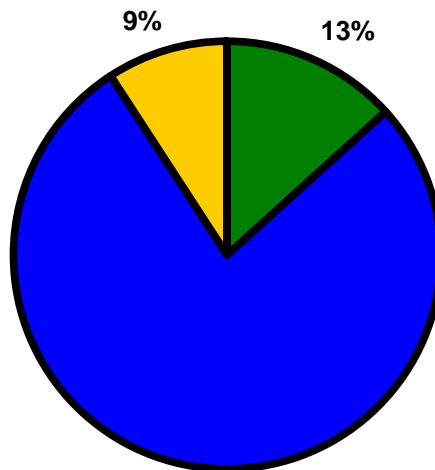
## Types of animals observed, Wisconsin NatureMapping, March 2007
